Erik, NY9D, is the chair of medical communication volunteers at the Medtronic Twin Cities Marathon and also the Red White and Boom Half Marathon. He was instrumental in the construction of the MN Statewide Packet Network, MN Statewide D-Star Network, and Reflector 53, and a new 5 GHz mesh network covering both cities. He is a regular contributor to the ARRL EmCom Newsletter, as well as QST and CQ Magazines and the TAPR Journal. He has spoken at Dayton on EmCom and QRP topics and at TAPR.

Slingshot, fishing pole, arrows, compressed air/gas launchers, climber spikes, or the best climbers sling shot. MARC has one we can use, I think the Club should have one too. I have been off the air (HF) almost a month now waiting for the tree trimmers to come. The commercial trimmers won't trim a tree that's too close to the power lines and Xcel doesn't want to spend any time trimming trees that aren't all that close. I guess it all depends on what your definition of "close" is. Anyway, I think everybody is happy now and the work will get done next week. Before the first date they were supposed to come, I dutifully took down my 80 meter Off Center Fed Dipole (OFCD) so that it wouldn't get hit with branches. It will be interesting to see how it works with a number of leaves and branches out of the way. When it was up before I could get it to load on the bottom half of 160 and all bands 80-10 (except 15). The OCFD is an interesting antenna. It is basically a dipole fed at the 1/3 point with a 4:1 balun and 50 ohm coax. It is reminiscent of what they used to call a "Windom," but that antenna was fed with a single bare line.

During my time with no HF to play with, I have been brushing up on my chess game which is covered with 45 years of dust and rust. I have joined a chess club at the library and have found a few programs and apps to play, so I am losing to both man and machine these days. Hopefully the cobwebs will clear and the gears will start turning. I could certainly use it.

FOR SALE HEATHKIT SB-200 Linear Amplifier

Rated at 600 watts output on SSB and 500 watts on CW. The unit looks pretty clean and I was told it was working when last used, but because of its age it is being offered **AS-IS**.

Note:

- This is not a plug-and-play deal for most folks. This unit will need to be modified to work with modern solid-state radios (*see https://harbachelectronics.com/*). But if you are willing to put in the time and money on the mods you will end up with a nice system costing less than 1/3 that of a new amplifier.
- This unit covers only the traditional 80-10 meter bands (no 160, no 6, no WARC).
- "Parts-only" examples of this unit sell for \$330-\$350 on eBay, plus postage.
- The complete assembly manual is available on line.

This package includes:

- The SB-200 (wired for 120v, easily changed)
- 2 new 572b replacement tubes (new old stock—still in wrapped package)

All for \$325. You pick up in Brooklyn Park or I will deliver to an SPRC meeting.


