Program:

John Kruk, N9UPC, presented a short history and explanation of Yaesu's System Fusion. He is a Yaesu employee and is a staunch supporter of the Fusion system. He enjoys talking to radio clubs about the Fusion advantages. The main advantage that Yaesu offers is having one repeater for both digital and analog communications, with automatic switching between the modes. It also offers the Wires-X function, to allow radio communications around the world by internet, between two Wires-X repeaters. John's presentation was well received, and a long session of questions (and answers) followed.


