SDR BCB DX'n by Scott Holisky NOAR

Winter is upon us and with it comes the best time for broadcast band reception. Ground conductivity has improved with the frozen tundra. Signals are generally stronger and reception that wouldn't be possible in six months are easy pickings now. The thunder-

storm activity is at a minimum across the country. Those missing sunspots that limit our DX activity only help improve conditions on the low end of the dial.

I still keep a paper list of the "AM Clear Channel" stations in my log book. There's still magic in tuning across the band and hearing signals from all over the continent. Go to the <u>Wikipedia list</u>, Click on the stations call letters for information or click on the coordinates to see where the transmitter is located.

The on-line shortwave receiver has evolved from a guy in Michigan pointing his internet camera at his receiver to the modern SDR version. There are hundreds of open receivers just waiting to be logged into. One of my favorite flavors or equipment is the KiwiSDR. It is easy to use, sounds great and has the ability to host up to four users at once. There are lots of YouTube Videos on this little rig. A good place to start finding active rigs is at the VE3SUN site. Unlike Matt's sites that he used for transmitting, these are just receive and generally free to use. Of course if you are going to make it a regular site that you use, I'm sure the owner would appreciate a donation.

The SDR sites technical equipment can range from a serious DX'ers dream antennas to a short active antenna and everything in-between. There are lots of other SDR sites on the web and range the whole spectrum in frequency coverage. Most can be accessed and controlled with just your modern browser. Tuning and radio controls are just a just a point and click.

A QRP Echolink friend, Mike WA8BXN in Cleveland, had a Kiwi attached to a 6BTV. The cost for the gear was about \$300. The impact to his internet speed wasn't an issue. Listening to our local BCB stations was pretty cool, hearing my own signal on the HF bands was even better! No better way to confirm how much changing power levels affects what the other station hears.


Give it a try there's lots to be heard!
